The guest speaker will be Earl Fisher, who will talk about growing up around America's test plane program in Muroc California during WWII and post-war. Then we got to the most interesting part of the evening. Nick Ugolini gave a talk and slideshow on

his adventures (and misadventures) delivering a Long-EZ aircraft to California. As we always mention, these types of presentations are MUCH more interesting to see in-person than read about later, but I'll try to recount some of the key points. It all started a couple years ago when the Long-EZ had a collapsed nose gear in North Carolina and Nick was asked to help repair it. That eventually led to a major gutting of the cockpit wiring, electronics and other systems, and so many modifications that it ended up being one of the most advanced Long-EZ in the world.



Fast-forward to October 2011 and it was time for Nick to deliver the aircraft to the owner in Fullerton, CA. With a 198 kt cruise speed and a top speed of 238 kts, Nick made great time crossing the states, but he did have some harrowing experiences, including burning out an ignition system and flying through serious icing. Needless to say, Nick learned a lot about mountain flying on his trip!



The best parts of the trip for Nick was meeting friends he made in the online Canard community. They were always willing to share their hangars, tools and even their homes with Nick as he journeyed west. That's what the EAA is all about; the sharing of friendship and knowledge.
